



## Jackpot Sit 'n' Go Tournament Rules

**VERSION: 1.4**

**DATE OF LAST UPDATE: August 26, 2020**

1. The Jackpot Sit 'n' Go (**JSNG**) tournament is a three player poker tournament.
2. Players may register for and actively play in a maximum of four JSNG tournaments at a time.
3. Once registered for a tournament, a player is committed to participating in that tournament. However, if a player remains registered for five minutes without a game commencing, they are automatically unregistered (or offered the option to choose to remain waiting). *Note that this is unlikely but may occasionally happen during off-peak hours and is a measure implemented for the protection of players.*
4. Players are required to buy-in upon joining a JSNG tournament.
5. Tournament buy-in amounts for Gold Coin and Sweeps Coins games are specified on the Global Poker website and in the game. The buy-in amounts may change from time to time.
6. There is no set rake for JSNG tournaments. Instead, the house holds 6.0% on average (see prize structure below).
7. Each player starts with the same size chip stack.
8. The prize pool is randomly determined (using a weighted RNG model) before the tournament starts and can be up to 10,000 times the Gold Coin or Sweeps Coin buy-in amount.
9. The last remaining player in the tournament (i.e. the player who has all of the chips in their possession) is the winner.
10. The JSNG tournament prize structure is as follows:

11. The majority of JSNG tournaments are played as 'winner-takes-all' tournaments but for the highest tier there may at times be a prize structure where first place receives 75% of the prize pool, second place receives 15% of the prize pool and third place receives 10% of the prize pool. The prize structure is configurable.
12. If a JSNG tournament is cancelled before the tournament commences, registered players will be refunded their buy-in amounts in full, including their proportion of the percentage held by the house.
13. If a JSNG tournament is cancelled after the tournament commences but before the prize allocation stage, all remaining players will be refunded their proportion of the buy-in amount held by the house and the prize pool will be allocated according to the following formula:
  - 13.1. 50% of the prize pool will be allocated equally between all remaining players; and
  - 13.2. 50% of the prize pool will be allocated proportionally between all remaining players based on their chip count at the time of cancellation.
14. If a JSNG tournament is cancelled after the prize allocation stage the prize pool will be allocated between all remaining players according to the following formula:
  - 14.1. each remaining player will receive from the prize pool the minimum prize that has not yet been awarded in the tournament; and
  - 14.2. the balance of the prize pool will be allocated proportionally between all remaining players based on their chip count at the time of cancellation.
15. In no circumstances is an eliminated player entitled to any refund of funds used to purchase Gold Coins.
